This is a peer-to-peer learning opportunity. Each presenter will use one of their projects, such as the wetlands assimilation project in the Central Wetlands Unit or volunteer-based planting efforts to share in detail the ways in which different entities are tackling the challenge of coastal land loss.

What are the driving forces behind the projects? What new technologies or processes are being tested? What obstacles have the project teams encountered, and how are they tracking the success of their efforts? How do these efforts fit into the big picture of the Coastal Master Plan and long-range planning?
